

OSHA 10 HOUR FOR CONSTRUCTION

Tues. January 30th – Wed. January 31st, 2018 Presented by: Jack Moeding \$175

Jack has 20 years of experience in dealing with various types of safety issues. Jack incorporates this experience into the OSHA 10 hour class so you can incorporate at your facility.

Description: This training program is intended to provide entry level construction workers information about their rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint as well as how to identify, abate, avoid and prevent job related hazards on a construction site. The training covers a variety of construction safety and health hazards which a worker may encounter at a construction site.

Professional Inspector, Level 1 or Level 2

This certification is designed for the individual working for a legally licensed business that is properly insured to offer Professional (third party) Inspections as described in Chapter 1, Section B.1.2 of the ANSI-ACCT 03-2016 Standards.

An applicant in a supervisory role can also apply for the Supervisor Endorsement (In-House or Professional) The applicant must meet the requirements for Level 1 or Level 2 Certification based on the level of inspectors that he/she supervises. This is an additional exam taken immediately after completing the respective Level 1 and Level 2 exam/s for In-House or Professional Certification.

ACCT will offer a Prep Course on February 1, 2018 to assist the applicant in preparation for the exam/s. This course is a valuable opportunity to review materials and discuss questions pertaining to inspection knowledge and skills. This course is recommended but not required.

All applicants must complete an eligibility file to be approved by the ACCT Inspector Certification Committee. No applicant will be allowed to sit for the certification exam/s without an approved file. There is no WALK-IN option for this testing. You must apply and submit documents no later than December 18, 2017.
